



Those undeniable and unforgettable feelings of loneliness—they haunt you.

You and I know that the wound that hurts you the most is the one inflicted by your father. That word alone causes you to feel anxiety. His addiction to alcohol paved a road for you that you did not desire to travel. As a young girl, your heart told you something was not right, and even though your father lives in the same house, it is as if you live with a stranger. On occasion, you feel like you're living with an enemy.

No longer are you a little girl. You're growing older and his behavior can no longer be covered up as easily. You are well-acquainted with the smell of alcohol; the scent is more familiar than his cologne. Your tears, heartache, inconsistencies, and wishful thinking have piled up. You are tired, exhausted, and ready to give up.

I take myself out of the equation and let God give the revelation.

Congratulations on accomplishing junior high school! Your family is so proud of your hard work. Throughout your life, God's mighty favor has already been on your life—in ways you have yet to comprehend. This letter is meant to present you with strong advice for high school which begins in September. There are some fundamentals that you must understand as a newly born again Christian.

Until now, you have grown accustomed to a Christian educational environment where your teachers genuinely care about molding you into an intelligent God-fearing man. These teachers have presented the saving grace of Christ in addition to math, science, history, etc. Your elementary and junior high experience has consisted of this, and it's all you have ever known.

High school will definitely be a challenge because Christ will not be Lord and Savior to everyone there. The teachers may care about you somewhat, but their paycheck does most of the talking. Amongst your classmates you'll experience kids being expelled, indulging in drugs/alcohol, boasting about sexual immorality, cursing, gossiping, back biting, and even a few suicides. As a 14-year-old, you might be wondering if God has taken a vacation. Although I don't worry about you caving into peer pressure (you won't), I strongly encourage you to stay focused on Christ. When you trusted and accepted Jesus as your personal savior, He promised to accompany you wherever you go. He hasn't taken a vacation at all.

Daily prayer, scripture reading, worship, fellowshipping with other believers, and attending church are not negotiable. The harsh reality is that once you become a child of God, you also become a despised enemy of Satan. Satan daily throws things at you (mentally, physically, emotionally, etc.) hoping that you'll lose focus of Jesus as Lord. This is called spiritual warfare and you cannot be ignorant of this. First, I want to let you know that you are beautiful, smart, and your worth is priceless. Never let anyone have the power over you to tell you differently or allow someone to make you think anything different. I know that you have been keeping all of your feelings bottled up since you were 13 years old. Being that you are 26 now, you need to let go of the pain, anger, and regret from the hurtful memories. The pain will only get worse if you don't. You will understand once I share this with you.

I just want to share some things that I would share with my daughter, cousin, aunt, mother or friend—especially with you. I really hope you pay attention because I know that so many times you have looked for love in the wrong places. You needed an outlet because the love you were seeking from family just wasn't there. I know that when you hurt so bad inside and keep it all in, it feels like death coming for you. You yearn for a place to call home, but nowhere can you find that comfort. Your soul feels like it's gone, like you're empty. I want you to know that it doesn't have to be that way.

When I was around your age, maybe a year or so older, I woke up one morning in my friend's den with my 2 kids in my arms. I prayed that the night before was just a nightmare. My eyes were puffy from crying. I had the biggest headache I have ever had in my life. My head was hurting from getting kicked and socked. The inside of my eye was bloodshot red, almost a deep shade of burgundy. The outside of my eye was already bruised purple and blue. My lower lip was busted and swollen.

It wasn't just an argument this time. I don't even know what I did or said to make him do this to me. I somehow just knew that it was my fault. When he came in, I heard the door slam. I immediately tried to pretend I was asleep. He came into the room and began yelling, mumbling. The aroma of weed and alcohol filled our bedroom. It

really seems like a big blur with flashes of a swing coming toward me, his boot coming toward me.

At first I tried to fight back, but I couldn't. All I could do was curl up into a ball. My kids were ages 3 and 1. All I could think about was them. I didn't want them to see this, but it was better he was hitting me and not them. After all was said and done, he took my car and parked in front of our apartment to make sure I didn't leave.

I threw some things in a backpack and a diaper bag. As soon as I saw the car drive away, I put my kids' shoes on. I took them and ran down the alley to get to a bus stop. I hid behind the bench at the bus stop. When I got on the bus, I went to a friend's house.

I stayed away for just 2 days. Just 2 days.... Not long enough.

When I returned home, I found a letter full of empty promises of how it will never happen again and how he didn't know what he was doing because he was under the influence of weed and alcohol. I read about how he had never done this before to anyone and that he will never do it again. He expressed his sorrow and said that he prayed that I can forgive him. Tears poured out of my eyes when I read about how sorry he was and I was all he had. He begged me not to take my kids and leave. I didn't know if I was crying because I had never endured this kind of pain before. Or if I felt sorry for him because he had no one else. Or if it was because if I left him, I didn't have anyone else either. I think it was all three reasons.

As I looked around, I felt like my world was shattered. This should have been a red flag to run! Tears streamed down as I stared at the hole in my 50-inch projection TV that he kicked in, my kids' Xbox smashed on the floor, and my cell phone smashed in the middle of the street. It wasn't the material things I was crying over, but how much destruction he just did to our lives that we tried to build together. I remember thinking to myself and wondering why I came back, why I was here.

Then he walked in. He came and hugged me. I began sobbing uncontrollably and allowed him to hold me. I needed the comfort, but from him it was bittersweet.

I stayed with him way too long. Years of mostly emotional and mental abuse continued, some physical. I know now that none of that was my fault. Never did I ask for him to call me names, belittle me, treat me badly, keep money from me, cheat on me, or hit me. I was too scared to leave. He was very intimidating. His goal was to make me scared so he could control me. He did a very good job because he was successful. He made me do a lot of things I knew I shouldn't have done and I took the fall.

I was depressed for a very long time, but the majority of the time I wore my "happy mask." I allowed myself to gain so much weight and I began to believe all of the negative things he said about me. I know now that I am worth so much more. I am left dealing with and sorting out my feelings all on my own, as well as my children's feelings. At least that's what I thought until I found a man.

This man is very different from all of the men who have been in my life before. He wakes up beside me and goes to sleep next to me. He makes me feel good about myself. I chose to write about this certain topic because it means a lot to me to be able to reach and help one person in this situation to gain the courage to leave before it's too late. I couldn't have done it without God. I now realize what comes before all of these other things going on in my life, the most important aspect of who I am is this: I am a child of God.

to God more than ever. Learn to grow closer to our family: Jenni, Ale, Alfredo, Ma and Daddy. Strengthen those relationships. For through them, you will be strengthened.

I know that you are a very mature young lady, but I made a few mistakes during this time. I pushed those around me away, including all our close friends and family. Due to that I have a hard time opening up to close friends, and especially with our family. When it is hardest to love those around you because you are hurt, angry, and upset at the world, love them the most because the Lord will be manifested there.

During this time I made a terrible mistake and got even angrier with God. I pushed Him away and left the church for good after the surgery occurred. I was 18 when this happened. Yes, we made it back to the Lord, into His kingdom (so don't worry). However, I made our journey that much harder. I experienced things that the Lord did not want for us. Dear Teenage Teri,

Dad said he would die. He didn't know it would be on New Year's Day during your senior year of high school, but he had been fairly certain about the risk of heart attack. Quitting smoking hadn't saved him from a triple bypass at age 45. His health had declined since he became the head girls' basketball coach, to coach you and help you win a basketball scholarship to Willamette University, his alma mater.

In a lot of ways, Dad died for you when your sister was born. As unexpected a blessing as she was, Dad knew that he wasn't going to be able to give her what he should. Even before she was born, he told you that she was going to be your responsibility because he wasn't always going to be around for her. And then when she was born, he constantly reminded you that you had to take care of her because you didn't know if he was going to be there the next day.

Honey, that's a lot of responsibility for a nine-year-old to shoulder. Maybe too much.

Dad was trying to prep you in his way—that forceful, no bull\$#!+ way that he had. He just never knew how much you took it to heart or how seriously you would try to honor his wishes throughout the years. He would never know how much it hurt to see him spend so much more time with your sister and to have him call her his favorite. You never had the courage to say to him, "What about me? I'm not going to have you around much longer either."

You quietly prayed that you would have the strength to be the person your father wanted you to be.

So much of who you are is shaped by the whirlwind of your Dad's personality. He was truly a force of nature—competitive, humorous, generous, engaging, magnetic. That was Dad. Everybody loved and respected him. He cared so deeply for "his boys," investing

so much in the kids he coached in basketball, football, baseball, and track. You saw firsthand how he impacted lives and changed t hem forever.

You also struggled with seeing the side of Dad that "his boys" and those in the community never saw—the eruption of temper, the swearing rants in Japanese, the simmering tension during the days he and mom fought, the silent nights he slept on the couch. You took him at his word when he said that if you didn't behave he would either kick you out of the house or leave and go find another family. After all, that's what he had done to his first family, he had left them.

You be the best daughter you can be and you quietly pray that he will stay.

Then he dies.

You turn to the Lord in prayer because He has been the constant for you. You know that He will never leave you. You know that only He can be there to give you the strength to deal with the arrangements at the hospital, at the funeral home, at school where Dad will no longer be.

Dad's death is your darkest night. At school, you have to deal with the girl who threatens to beat you up every day all on your own now. Dad can't save you; he's not there.

And I warn you, darker days are coming. You will go to Dad's college in the fall, become ill, and lose the basketball scholarship you and he worked so hard to win. Over the next months, you will lose your half brother to AIDS and your grandfather to the same heart attack that killed your father. Your sister—the sister you left—will struggle with mourning the loss of a family forever broken and fight against the new family your mother is trying to make.

There it really is. After Dad dies, you leave her. You leave your sister when he told you that she was the only thing that mattered to him, that her wellbeing is your responsibility. You can't even help her find God in her grief.

The weight of years of guilt stifle your soul, but I'm here to tell you that it's a burden you don't need to bear. Your quiet prayers will be heard by a loving Heavenly Father who will never give up on finding your sister and opening her soul to finally hear Him. Your plaintive prayers asking whether Dad went to heaven will finally be answered.

Later, you will realize that Dad loved you enough to coach you. He saw the basketball court as the ultimate proving ground—for life as well as the game. Dad believed in the integrity of hard work and the blood, sweat, and tears you had to sacrifice to compete. As much as he taught through his coaching that life is more than just winning, he also encouraged countless kids that playing was winning. He believed that if you play the game of life right, you will win. If you don't give up in the fourth quarter, you can stand tall because you gave it your all.

Dad never played to lose and he never gave up on anyone he ever coached. That includes you.

As the Lord's Prayer says: "And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us."

Forgive, Teri. Forgive yourself for wanting Dad to spend as much time with you as he did with your sister and as he did with other kids. He knew that they needed him. Forgive him for laying too much responsibility on an overly sensitive girl who would be chained by sadness for years to come.

Forgive him for being right: You have been alright all along. You don't need your father any more to be strong; you are already strong. You don't need your father to say, "Good job"; you do your best every day. You've stepped onto the court, played a hard game, and won.

I'm writing to you now from a place of peace and knowledge that will take you almost two decades to reach. Have faith.

You're in the first quarter of life, just finding the rhythm of the game. Remember the drills; have faith in your skills. God is your coach now. Dad was His assistant coach warming you up, getting

you ready for the game. Know that because you're playing now, the momentum is shifting. You are already on your way to winning.
